


GRAMMAR REVIEW – CAUSATIVE **HAVE** AND **GET**


The Causative Form is used when we do not do something ourselves, but we arrange for someone else (usually an expert) to do it for us.

Formation


Subject + **have/get** + object + past participle





Unit 10 – Life Matters

- Has this brought you happiness?






Reading: The happiness of nations
